And we had a bumper number of DIAMOND award winners

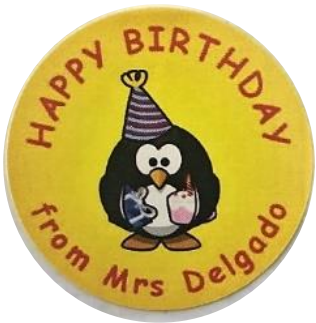
