### Dogs on and around the school site

As you are aware, we do not permit dogs onto the school site. This is for health and safety reasons, in addition to some children being very scared of dogs, regardless of size. Having moving groups of children, making the expected level of noise that children make, could startle a dog and cause them to react. Some children will stroke, pat or touch dogs, unaware if their temperament is suited to being so close to a child – again, this could cause a dog to react. We have also noticed that when some children come in through the gates, they are very nervous when passing a dog.

As a school, we would like to ask any parents who bring a dog on the school run to allow plenty of distance between their dog and the children coming in and out of school and not to bring their dog to the entrance/exit gates. Myself and Mrs Wallen are on the gate every morning, so if you need to stop a distance away, we are able to keep eyes on your child as they walk into school. On behalf of all our school community, I thank you in advance for your support.

### The Mighty Mile!

As part of the school's P.E. provision, children from year 1-6 will be running twice a week to improve the physical, social, emotional and mental health and wellbeing of our children. The Mighty Mile is a social physical activity, with children running, jogging or walking – at their own pace – in the fresh air with friends. The children will need to bring their trainers in on the days they are running, which will be confirmed at the parent information session.

## Reading Awards 2025-26

Reading is the key that opens and gives access to all areas of the curriculum. At St George's we consider reading to be a key skill that every child needs, as early as possible, so as to reach their full potential.

To positively encourage reading at home, the reading reward system will start again from **Monday 8<sup>th</sup> September**. Over the course of this year, there will be the opportunity for your child to earn certificates of achievement, once they complete a certain number of reads with a relevant comment by a parent or adult that your child has been reading to. For the younger children, it may be that your child's reading experience for that day was sharing a book with an adult. As the children move into Years 5 and 6 and become more independent readers, this comment may be written by your own child around what they particularly enjoy, or a word or phrase that they needed to check to meaning of.

Each class teacher will keep a track of parent/child comments, in addition to the support we give for reading at school, and once the certain number of reads are reached, your child will receive a reading certificate. The totals are

**50 reads ~ BRONZE READER, 100 reads ~ SILVER READER**

**150 reads ~ GOLD READER, 200 reads ~ DIAMOND READER**

**250 reads ~ SUPER READER and 300 reads ~ CHAMPION READER!**

It would be fantastic to award every child in the school a certificate reaching the milestones. There have been occasions when books have been returned with water or food damage. We understand that accidents happen, and it is especially easy for water bottles to pop open in book bags. However, due to the cost involved in purchasing and then replacing these books, we have to ask parents/carers to please ensure your children are careful when using the books at home or transporting them to/from school. If books are damaged at home, we will be asking the family responsible to pay for a replacement via the school payment system. Alternatively, you can purchase the book yourself and send it in to school. As always, thank you for your support.

## Communication

As a school we felt that the communication between teachers and parents was very effective last year due to using the email system. If you need to contact your child's teacher, email them via the office [office@st-georges.southend.sch.uk](mailto:office@st-georges.southend.sch.uk) and mark it for their attention, or for the year group. You will receive a confirmation email that it has been received and the teacher will reply at the earliest opportunity. It may be after the school day has finished, or the next day, due to looking into a matter or due to the teacher not being in school. Please be assured that it will be dealt with. As ever, the staff thank you in advance for your support and patience.

## Children being collected from school

If there is a change to who will be collecting your child at the end of the day, we ask that you email the office so the message can be passed on immediately. It would also be useful, where possible, if you could introduce the adults that are to pick up your child in your absence. If your child is in Year 6 and walking home, we also need a letter/email confirming this.

## Lunches

As a school we promote healthy eating and healthy lunches for all our children. For a child to grow and develop properly, it is vital that they are eating a suitable diet. An example of a healthy lunchbox should:

- be based on starchy carbohydrates (bread, potatoes, rice, pasta)
- include fresh fruit and vegetables/salad
- include a source of protein such as meat, fish, eggs, cheese (or dairy alternative)
- include a side dish such as a yoghurt (or dairy alternative), tea cake, fruit bread, plain rice/corn cakes, homemade plain popcorn, sugar-free jelly
- include a still drink such as water, sugar-free or no-added-sugar drinks

It may be that children have the occasional packet of crisps or a chocolate covered biscuit etc, **but it should not contain:**

- sweets or pure chocolate bars (such as Dairy Milk, Wispa etc),
- fast food/left over takeaway from previous day
- food that is highly processed/high saturated fat content

All of these are directly linked to obesity and future health issues, such as diabetes. Lunch boxes are regularly monitored to ensure that the children have enough to eat and are eating the right types of food and with 210 to check, we would appreciate your support in not including unsuitable items.

## Infant Lunches

Don't forget that we need to receive your order by Wednesday for the following week. If not, we will presume that you wish to provide lunch for your child. We cannot process orders after Thursday as the completed orders have been sent to our supplier. Thank you in advance for your support. ## Healthy Snacks

Just a reminder that all infant classes receive fruit or vegetables to encourage healthy eating. Juniors can also bring in a healthy snack for break time. Healthy snacks include fresh fruits (apples, bananas, berries), vegetable sticks (carrots, cucumber, peppers), whole grains such as wholemeal crackers or oatcakes, and dried fruit without added sugar.

## Nuts

We have children at St. George's who have severe anaphylactic allergies triggered by peanuts and other nuts. The key to preventing an anaphylactic reaction is to avoid exposure to the trigger. **Please do not send foods containing nuts or peanuts to school. This includes Nutella spread and peanut butter.** We also ask that children do not have chocolate spread sandwiches, as we are unable to check if it does contain nuts or not.

## Uniform

Thank you for sending your children back to school so smartly dressed on the first day of term. Could you please check that all the children's items are named as we already have a few items which have been found unmarked.

## Jewellery and Hair

Just to remind all parents that on health and safety grounds, we do not allow children to wear any jewellery in our school, including earrings. If your child had their ears pierced during the summer holiday and the healing process is still not complete by the time school starts again in September, we ask that you use micro pore tape or plasters to cover each ear to minimise the risk of the earring being caught and tearing the soft lobe or penetrating the bone behind the ear should there be unintentional contact during the school day. The wearing of earrings may also prevent the child from taking part in physical activities, both in curriculum time and extra-curricular activities.

Hair should be away from the face so as to not cause a distraction, and should be presentable and suitable for school. The school does not permit children to have extreme haircuts; this includes logos or patterns cut into the hair. Children's hair should not be coloured or bleached. Hair bands, clips etc should be red, white, navy or black. Make up and/or nail varnish should not be worn during the school day. Similarly, temporary transfers or fake 'tattoos' are not appropriate and should be washed off.

The Friends of St George's AGM will take place on **Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> September @ 2.45pm.**

As parents/carers at St George's School, you are all members and are invited to attend. The Friends of St Georges are looking for enthusiastic volunteers who are willing not only to raise money which will benefit all of the pupils at the school, but also help organise and run social events throughout the year. If you feel that you would like to play an active part in the school community, you may like to consider putting yourself forward for one of the positions.

**Each post is for a year and at the end of that time you can choose to either stand down or put yourself forward for re-election.**

The posts are: Chair, Vice-Chair, Treasurer and Secretary

If you think you may be interested and would like a little more information, please contact **Felicity Miller**, our current chair, who is happy to give further information about the different posts.

In addition to these, we also need CLASS REPS. This role requires you to be a link between the committee and parents/carers in that class, giving information, asking for support and taking forward any ideas etc. The class reps need to be nominated in the same way as the other FOSG positions.

Any person wishing to put themselves forward for any of these positions must complete the nomination form which can be found on the school website and at the end of this newsletter.

## Punctuality

Being at school on time helps children start the day ready to learn, feel confident, and not miss anything important. Arriving on time every day supports better learning, builds routines, and sets children up for success now and later. The gates are open from 8.40am until 8.55am. After this time, the children will need to enter school via the front gate and will be marked late.

This term, there will be a competition for the class with the best punctuality. The winners will have a visit to the park arranged for the end of the autumn term as their reward. Any class with 100% punctuality on a weekly basis will get to enjoy a 'GOLDEN time' session of the class's choice. I will share each class's attendance in the weekly newsletter.

## Leave of Absence Procedure

Children need to be in school every day to get the most out of their learning. When they miss days, it's harder to catch up and can affect their confidence and impacts on their learning. Being in school helps them keep a routine, stay connected with friends, and build good habits that last a lifetime. The Local Authority will issue Penalty Notice fines for unauthorised absences during term time.

**Who may be fined?** Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent who allows their child to be absent from school. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent who allowed the holiday receiving 3 separate fines.

### **First Offence**

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for an unauthorised term time holiday the fine amount will be: £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days, increasing to £160 if paid between days 22-28.

### **Second Offence (within 3 years)**

The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be: £160 per parent (who allowed the holiday), per child, payable within 28 days.

### **Third Offence and any Further Offences (within 3 years)**

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and local authorities will need to consider other available measures to address the absence concerns. This may mean that cases are presented before a Magistrate's Court. Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines of up to £2,500. Cases found guilty in the Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

### **National Threshold**

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period. For example: a 5 day holiday would meet the national threshold. The 10- school week period can span different terms/academic years.

Procedure for requesting exceptional leave of absence Applications for leave of absence for extremely exceptional circumstances should be made in the first instance, on the Leave of Absence form (see school website or school office). Every request will be considered on its merits and must be for the minimum period possible. In some circumstances the Headteacher may arrange a meeting to discuss the application or request further information.

### **Celebration Day 2026 – Friday 26<sup>th</sup> June 2026**

Celebration Day is the opportunity for parents and carers (and any other family members) to spend the day with their child/ren and the whole school community.

The children come to school in their P.E. kit for the day – no need for any change of clothes.

We encourage the children to wear a coloured t-shirt which indicates their house team.

Parents, carers and families are also encouraged to wear house colours! Sports morning usually begins around 9.15am in Shoebury Park. Families can bring chairs, blankets etc to sit on.

After sports morning, the children will be taken back into school so they can cool down, have a drink and use the toilet if needed. Families can then set themselves up in the park (or under shade in the playground if you would prefer), for their picnic lunch. At 11.30am, we ask that one adult per family come and collect their child from the usual end of day place so they can join you for lunch.

At 12.30pm, I will come out to the playground and onto the field and ring the bell for the children to return so that we can get ready for the marvellous musical performances in the afternoon! Once again, they will be able to have a cool drink and use the toilet. This will give

parents of Reception, year 1 and 2 time to gather in the hall for their performance. Parents of older child can take their time as years 3, 4, 5 & 6 will be performing from 1.10pm onwards. It is a wonderful day, where all our families come together to celebrate the children of St George's. The date is in the diary section so you can already start making any necessary arrangements.

### Pre-loved Uniform

We would like ensure a stock of good quality second hand uniform of all sizes which will be available for anyone who needs it. If you have any uniform your child will no longer use, please drop it into school to be sorted. We are looking for shirts, dresses, skirts, shorts, trousers, PE kits, raincoats, winter coats, school shoes etc. Please only send in good quality items.

### Emergency Alerts Test

On Sunday 7 September 2025 at 3pm, the government will carry out a national test of the Emergency Alerts system. This means most mobile phones and tablets across the UK will receive a test message, accompanied by a loud siren-like sound and vibration that will last for about 10 seconds.

The message you receive will clearly state that this is a test and that no action is required on your part. The alert will come through even if your device is set to silent mode, which is an important feature of the system designed to ensure people receive warnings in genuine emergencies.
